Here is a chance for you to gain international recognition for your work! The “**Philippe de Woot Award**” is for any student graduated from a University or Business School at Master level over the world, whose thesis is about corporate social responsibility or the contribution of companies to sustainable development. Candidates must have completed their thesis in 2021-2022 or in 2022-2023.

The award-winner will receive a prize of € 3,000. €1,500 will be directly given to the student and the remaining €1,500 will be offered to an environmental or a social project to be chosen by the student.

The award ceremony will be organized in **March, 2024**. To ensure the recognition of this Prize and a large diffusion of CSR, the awarding ceremony will take place at the time of a conference animated by reputed speakers from different backgrounds on the theme of CSR. Philippe de Woot de Trixhe was a doctor of law and economics and professor emeritus at the UCLouvain. His research and teaching areas were strategy, change in a turbulent environment, ethics and CSR.

Co-founder of the Louvain CSR Network and active member of the Global Responsible Leadership Initiative (GRLI), he received the Zeilli Marimo award in 2002, shedding light on the market's economy role in the progress of society and the future of mankind.
